Parental Prosocial Practices Questionnaire

The *Parental Prosocial Practices Questionnaire* consists of 9 items that describe parental prosocial socialization practices.

As illustrated below, each item or statement of the questionnaire is flanked by 5 numbers, which correspond to the frequency with which the behaviors described occur in everyday life. During the compilation, we ask you to indicate with a cross the choice made for each item.

Statistical reliability values:

Awareness of Internal States ($\alpha = .741$), Scaffolding ($\alpha = .708$) and Contingency ($\alpha = .748$).
